DAILY AFFIRMATION

A 3-DAY DEVOTIONAL ON PURPOSE, HEALING, AND SPIRIT-LED LIVING

DAY 1: ROOTING OUT DOUBLE-MINDEDNESS

James 1:8 says, "A double-minded man is unstable in all his ways." Double-mindedness often stems from a lack of clarity about our calling. When we don't know who we are or what we're here to do, we drift. We end up doing anything and everything—and find fulfillment in nothing. The enemy's goal, as Napoleon Hill puts it in *Outwitting the Devil*, is to turn us into drifters. But God has a better plan.

Reflection: Have you felt like you're drifting? What would it look like to live with focus?

Prayer Prompt: Lord, show me where I've been double-minded. Help me anchor myself in Your purpose.

DAY 2: THE VISION THAT TRANSFORMS

Proverbs 29:18 tells us, "Where there is no vision, the people perish." God invites us to partner with Him in shaping our future. He gives us dreams, desires, and visions. When you ask Him to show you a picture of your future, He will. And when you repeat that vision daily, your subconscious begins to align with it.

Reflection: What vision has God given you? Write it down. Can you visualize it every morning and evening?

Prayer Prompt: Father, paint a picture of the life You desire for me. I want to partner with Your plans.

DAY 3: HEALING THE HEART, RENEWING THE MIND

Psalm 147:3 says, "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds." Before we can walk in purpose, we must allow God to heal our hearts. Fear of failure, fear of criticism, and poor self-image often block us. But God is the Restorer. Through hearing His voice, we are made whole.

Reflection: What lies have you believed about yourself that need healing? What is God's truth over your life?

Prayer Prompt: Jesus, I invite You into the wounded places of my heart. Heal and restore me with Your love.
